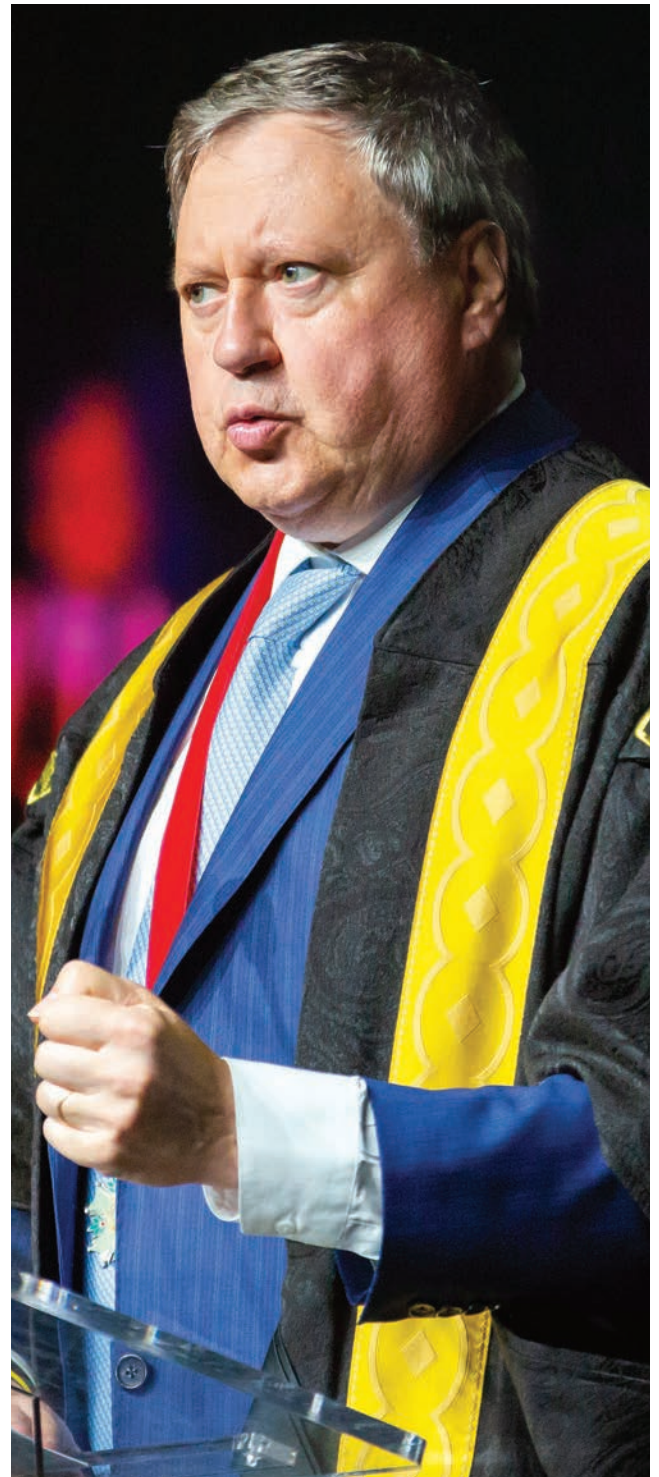

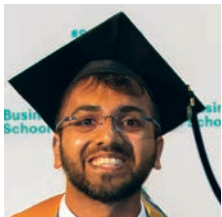

Adolf Ogi

Former President of Switzerland & Founder of the Freude herrscht Foundation Commencement Address

Born in the Swiss village of Kandersteg, Adolf Ogi completed his studies at the Ecole Supérieure de Commerce in La Neuveville, Switzerland, and attended the Swiss Mercantile School in London, going on to become the Director of the Swiss Ski Federation and Managing Director of Intersport Switzerland. He shifted from business to politics in 1979 when he was elected as a representative for the Canton of Bern at the Swiss National Council.

From 1988 to 2000, Mr. Ogi was a member of the Swiss government. During his time in office, he was a key player in many departments. From 1988 to 1995, Mr. Ogi was in charge of the Federal Department of Transport, Energy and Communication and, from 1995 to 2000, responsible for defense, civil protection and sports.

He was elected President of Switzerland in 1993 and 2000, and was appointed as special advisor to UN Secretary General Kofi Annan on Sport for Development and Peace in 2001. Additionally, he is Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Swiss Economic Forum.

Mr. Ogi currently focuses on humanitarian and charitable organizations such as the Freude herrscht Foundation, which he founded in honor of his late son, Mathias Adolf Ogi.

Jacques de Watteville holds a doctorate in law, for which he was admitted to the bar of the Canton of Vaud, and a business degree from the University of Lausanne. After serving as a delegate of the International Committee of the Red Cross in Lebanon, he began what was to become a long and successful career in diplomacy. He served as head of the Economic and Financial Affairs Division in the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (1997–2003) and as the Swiss Ambassador to Syria (2003–2007), then to the European Union in Brussels (2007–2012), and subsequently to China, Mongolia, and North Korea (2012–2013). Mr. de Watteville was State Secretary in charge of international financial matters in the Federal Department of Finance (2012–2016) and then Secretary of State in the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs, responsible for negotiations with the European Union (2015–2017). He is currently Chairman of the Board of Directors of Banque Cantonale Vaudoise (BCV).

The company caters to a variety of tastes, from authentic craft beers to Trappist brews made by monks.

Company founder, Jacques Amstein, was one of the first to believe in the potential of world beers in the Swiss market. He believed that he could expand consumers' tastes in foreign beers and gradually change their beer consumption habits. In this crusade, Amstein had to fight against entrenched habits and rigid regulations. In the end, imported beers quickly proved to be a success and foreign beer specialties became fashionable. It goes without saying that the 60-year-old has earned the respect of hop-lovers the world over.
